- Fulfill the duties and obligation of an appointed Community Advisory Committee Member

Member Qualifications:

- Must be a resident of Bertie County
- They, or their immediate family, must not have financial interest in the home served by the committee
- Cannot be employed by, or serve on a governing board of a home served by the committee
- May not have an immediate family member as a resident of a facility served by the committee

The committee meets every other month and makes quarterly facility visits.
